EDITORIAL



Dear Friends of Enfants du Monde,

In 2020, COVID-19 caused a global crisis in education and healthcare systems, hitting already fragile countries even harder.

School closures in Burkina Faso, Guatemala, Niger and Chad, lack of protective equipment for care staff in health centres... many challenges for our health and education programmes! Enfants du Monde adapted rapidly to reduce the impact of this crisis on our beneficiaries, babies, children, young people and pregnant women.

To continue improving maternal and newborn health we worked with Ministries of Health in Burkina Faso, Bangladesh, Haiti and El Salvador to distribute amongst other things, masks, hand gel, water dispensers and liquid soap to protect care staff. As you will discover from this annual report, we found ways to enable disadvantaged children to continue their education. We also obtained significant finance so that children living in emergency situations in Burkina Faso could have access to education.

In Switzerland, in schools in Geneva and Neuchâtel, we successfully completed two education projects on the rights of the child and on sustainable development.

None of this would have been possible without you. On behalf of the entire Enfants du Monde team, I would like to thank you sincerely for your invaluable support.

RESULTS

- Support 4 health programmes reaching 1,206,384 pregnant women, mothers and their babies in Burkina Faso, Bangladesh, El Salvador and Haiti.
- Train more than 3,920 health workers in health education and advice for pregnant women.

THE COVID-19 CHALLENGE FOR IMPROVING MATERNAL AND NEWBORN HEALTH

In 2020, the COVID-19 crisis hit the countries where we work, adversely affecting health systems which were already fragile and populations living in precarious conditions. Enfants du Monde responded to the pandemic with its local partners and the Ministries of Health in Burkina Faso, Bangladesh, Haiti and El Salvador.

SUPPORTING THE HEALTH SYSTEM AND POPULATIONS DURING COVID-19

Prevention for pregnant women and the population

Continuing to protect the populations, mothers-to-be and their babies was a priority for Enfants du Monde in 2020, despite the pandemic. We focused our efforts on communication and putting infection prevention measures in place.

Communication in local languages for pregnant women

In Burkina Faso, Enfants du Monde, working with the Ministry of Health and local partners, designed and distributed a poster in French and local languages (Moore and Fulfude) to 115 health centres, on how to prevent COVID-19 aimed specifically at pregnant women. In Haiti, posters were produced in Creole for 2,000 pregnant women.

In El Salvador, Enfants du Monde, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health, developed information leaflets on COVID-19 and the health of pregnant women, young mothers and newborns: **85,000 copies** were distributed in health centres.

Videos, radio spots and public announcements

In Bangladesh, as in Burkina Faso, videos demonstrating preventive measures were produced. To raise awareness amongst the population, messages in local languages on how to protect against COVID-19 were broadcast through radio spots in Haiti and Burkina Faso, and by public announcements in Haiti and Bangladesh.

Protection and training for healthcare staff

In most of the countries where we work, the health

system was ill-prepared and poorly equipped to deal with the pandemic. Healthcare professionals in hospitals and health centres were severely short of protective equipment.

In El Salvador, following close collaboration between Enfants du Monde and the Ministry of Health, **masks, eye protection and protective clothing** were distributed in 5 health areas of the country, for 3,134 care providers.

To support the Ministry of Health in Burkina Faso, Enfants du Monde supplied protective equipment for care providers in collaboration with the local IPC/BF partner (Private and Community Initiative for Health and Response to HIV/AIDS in Burkina Faso) and with financial support from the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC).

In the Centre-East together with the Centre-North and Cascades regions, 115 health centres received examination gloves, protective masks, hydroalcoholic gel, water dispensers and liquid soap. Finally, **1,273 health workers** received training in the prevention and control of the COVID-19 infection.

In Bangladesh, Enfants du Monde, through its partnership with BRAC the local NGO, trained care providers and supplied personal protective equipment. Almost 100,000 community and voluntary health workers were deployed in the field to educate the population about the key methods of controlling the spread of COVID-19.

In Haiti, water dispensers and soap as well as protective equipment (masks, gloves, hydroalcoholic gel) were supplied to health staff in 2 hospitals and 11 health centres in the Goâve region.

IMPROVING ACCESS TO MATERNAL AND NEWBORN HEALTH SERVICES

In 2020, Enfants du Monde continued to work towards improving maternal and newborn health through the WHO approach "Working with Individuals, Families and Communities" (IFC), that aims to strengthen the ability and capacity of local communities to respond.

Telemedecine

In Burkina Faso, Enfants du Monde supported the PANDA telemedicine system (Pregnancy and Newborn Diagnostic Assessment), to be used by health workers in local health centres. It helps reduce maternal and newborn mortality by improving antenatal visits, especially by diagnosing problem cases. A study was started in 2020 in 7 health centres using this system to assess the quality of care and antenatal checks.

Application "My baby and me"

"My baby and me", another mobile application, free of charge, for future and young mothers, was developed by Enfants du Monde in collaboration with the Ministry of Health in Burkina Faso, our local IPC/BF partner and the Geneva University Hospitals (HUG). The application presents reliable information on pregnancy, birth and the postnatal period, as well as how to protect against COVID-19. Using images and audio messages in local languages (Moore, Jula, Fulfude and Bissa) adapted to the cultural context, it is designed so that all women, literate or not, can access quality personalised information. "My baby and me" is currently being adapted for use in El Salvador.

Health education

In Bangladesh, the health education activities of our partner Bangladesh Rural Advancement Committee (BRAC) were disrupted between March and November 2020 due to restrictions on public gatherings. Health workers organised village information sessions for pregnant women limiting numbers to 10 participants. An online learning platform was developed at the end of 2020 to continue training for health workers. ■

EDUCATION IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION

COVID-19 has caused a global crisis in education, hitting countries with already fragile education systems even harder. In 2020, school closures impacted on learning, the well-being and the safety of children as well as access to essential school services such as canteens and vaccinations. In Burkina Faso, **Guatemala, Niger and in Chad, the education normally offered to children also protects them from abuse** such as forced labour or early marriage and gives them genuine future prospects.

PRESERVING A FRAGILE EDUCATION SYSTEM

Distance training for teachers and students

The COVID-19 crisis has exacerbated inequalities, particularly in respect to the digital divide, thus reducing the possibility for the most vulnerable to continue their learning. Enfants du Monde has modified its training by offering learning solutions adapted to the local context of each country.

In Guatemala, schools have been closed since March 2020, with children self-tutoring at home. In order to help maintain continuity in schooling, Enfants du Monde provided support to the Ministry of Education in the development of bilingual educational radio broadcasts in Maya and Spanish.

Radio has wide coverage nationally and reaches chil-

dren in the remotest and most disadvantaged areas of the country, where the majority of households have no

access to the internet or television. This is especially true in Alta Verapaz and Chimaltenango, two areas where our education programme operates.

Learning guides were also designed to make it easier for primary school children to work independently at home, in their mother tongue. A guide for teachers and another for future teachers in bilingual intercultural schools were also developed to reinforce their skills and competences as bilingual teachers.

To combat the COVID-19 pandemic, in addition to conventional controls, the Burkina Faso government very quickly established a number of preventive measures including the closure of schools and other educational facilities from 16 March 2020. Schools with the necessary protective equipment (wash basin, masks, etc.) finally reopened at the end of May 2020. Enfants du Monde provided financial support for various actions to ensure the protection of students and teaching staff.

Students from 13 classes and the management committee of these schools received 1,230 masks, 26 hand-washing stations and 40 bars of soap per class.

Local partners of Enfants du Monde organised small study groups enabling students to do their work supervised by their teacher.

The Ministry for National Education, Literacy and **Promotion of National Languages** (MENAPLN) developed several strategies for continuity in education such as the use of television, radio and online platforms.

Providing education for displaced children

In Burkina Faso, in the areas most affected by growing insecurity due to attacks by armed groups, more than half the children aged 3 to 17 do not attend school*. In order to provide quality education for displaced and vulnerable children, Enfants du Monde along with its local partners Andal and Pinal, the Foundation for Community Development in Burkina Faso and the Tin Tua Association, obtained funding from the global fund Education Cannot Wait to undertake several interventions (open schools, educational support, etc.).

Second Chance schools

In Niger, where Enfants du Monde continues to support the "second chance schools" for children aged between 9 and 13 who have never been to school or have dropped out early, security and COVID-19 crises were major challenges in 2020. With our local partner, Niger Organisation of Innovative Educators (ONEN) we distributed protection kits for the students, containing hand-washing facilities, fabric masks and hydroalcoholic gel, so that students could return to class in complete safety. ■


SUSTAINABLE IMPROVEMENT OF THE NATIONAL EDUCATION SYSTEM IN NIGER AND IN CHAD

Enfant du Monde's expertise in the field of quality education is recognised by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) which has granted us two very important mandates in Niger and in Chad.

A QUALITY EDUCATION FOR OUT-OF-SCHOOL YOUTH IN NIGER

With our partner Swisscontact, we engage at a pedagogical level in Community Centres for Alternative Education (CCEAJ) for youth aged 10 to 14 who are not in school or have dropped out.

There they learn to read, write, count and express themselves in two languages (their mother tongue and the official language of Niger, French), while being guided towards vocational training or further studies.

Taking in more students, safely

As a result of this successful educational strategy, **15 new centres were opened at the start of the 2020 school year,** bringing the total number of centres to 315 with 9,017 students, 50% of which were girls.

From mid-March to June 2020, the CCEAJs were closed in line with government measures to prevent and combat the COVID-19 pandemic.

Lessons restarted in June when water dispensers, soap, and masks for teachers and students were made available to ensure a completely safe return to school.

Training participants in the educational chain

360 teachers and 44 trainers received training in 2020 with the technical support of Enfants du Monde, despite several months' disruption to courses and teacher–supervised classes due to COVID-19.

The quality of the alternative education available is thus gradually improving due to the strengthening of training systems for participants along the whole educational chain.


NEW TEXTBOOKS AND DISTANCE TRAINING IN CHAD

In Chad, more than half of students drop out during the first 6 years of school and only 1 child in 5 can read and write at the end of primary school. To enable children to receive a quality education, Enfants du Monde is working in this country by mandate of the SDC, co-financed by the French Development Agency (AFD), in 4 provinces: Moyen-Chari, Batha, Mandoul and Wadi Fira. Among the many activities of the Programme, we can highlight the development of teaching materials and the training of teachers.

The development of textbooks and story books

In 2020, we helped develop a collection of teaching materials for all 5 primary school levels for children aged between 6 and 12. This collection was published in three languages: French, Arabic, and Sar – French and Arabic being the official languages and Sar a national language spoken in the provinces of southern Chad.

Altogether, **155,757 textbooks were distributed to 2,200 schools** in the 4 provinces, and this despite the difficulties caused by COVID-19, the state of the roads and the period where activities were suspended!

Delivering teacher training

Training for **7,741 primary school teachers** was organised in August 2020. They took part in intensive courses over 10 to 20 days and in pedagogical days. During this time, health protection measures were observed: handwashing kits and the distribution of masks.

SWITZERLAND: CHILDREN SPEAK OUT FOR THEIR RIGHTS

Enfants du Monde implemented two educational projects in Swiss classrooms on children's rights and on sustainable development. The project *A Fairer World* culminated in taking part in an event on International Children's Rights Day, and the project *Young Reporters* enabled children to present their rights in their own way through photos, video, audio or written texts.

Creating a virtual globe for children's rights

Through the project *A Fairer World*, Enfants du Monde has been working with schools in Switzerland and elsewhere for several years **to invite children aged 6 to 12 to discover their rights.**

In 2020, school children were encouraged to produce a photo, video or written text illustrating a right which was particularly important to them. Their creations were then displayed on a giant globe which travelled around the schools as well as on a Virtual Globe created in 2020.

Developed with the valuable support of the *Centre professionnel du Nord vaudois*, the Virtual Globe consists of **more than 5,000 creations from children all over the world.** It thus became a beyond-border exchange platform.

Dialogue between children and the Committee on the Rights of the Child in Geneva

Every year on the 20th of November, on International Children's Rights Day, Enfants du Monde invites children taking part in the project *A Fairer World* to an event. So in 2020, the Festival *"The children's voice"* aimed to give Geneva schoolchildren the opportunity to express themselves on the theme **"the right to equality"**. Initially planned to take place at the Place des Nations in Geneva, the event took place digitally because of the COVID-19 epidemic. Songs, art, photos and story-telling: throughout the day, children took part in workshops and activities.

The oldest children made a giant fresco guided by press cartoonists **Patrick Chappatte** and **Gérald Herrmann**. The youngest took part in a reading-de-

bate with the singer and author **Licia Chery**, based on her story "*Ticheré has frizzy hair*", which aims to introduce children to the real-life diversity of the world.

The creations from these workshops formed part of a virtual dialogue between the children and representatives of the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child, Geneva authorities and other NGOs actively working to promote and protect children's rights.

Young reporters in Neuchâtel

In 2020, the Protection Service for Adults and Young people (SPAJ) in the canton of Neuchâtel requested Enfants du Monde and Terre des Hommes Suisse (TdHS) to conduct a second phase of the awareness campaign on children's rights entitled *10months-10rights*. Each month, a specific right from the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child is addressed in various ways: exhibitions, training, events, conferences, films, activities.

School children from the canton of Neuchâtel took on the role of journalists journalists and spent several months working on exploring children's rights, doing research, conducting interviews, and creating video, photo and written reports. An opportunity to understand and claim their rights, to meet professionals and experts, to tell their experiences and those of other children and young people. Made possible through the support of Enfants du Monde and TdHS (following up the idea of Young Reporters developed for the 30th anniversary of the Convention on the Rights of the Child), these reports can be found in a free travelling exhibition in 2021.



FINANCIAL SUMMARY 2020

2020 fiscal year analysis

In a difficult global situation, Enfants du Monde has succeeded in limiting the impact of the pandemic on its programmes and financial performance, whilst ensuring the safety of its staff and partners. The overall level of income for the year 2020 is slightly increased compared with 2019. The decrease in funding from some corporate donors was offset by funds obtained from new donors. Additional finance was also obtained for actions on COVID-19 information and prevention in the countries where we work, as well as for the acquisition of protective equipment for caregivers, in coordination with local partners. The effects of the reduction in funding from some general public streams were limited thanks to more significant spontaneous donations, especially online.

Project expenses (including the mandates) decreased slightly compared with 2019. Ongoing programmes have continued, however some activities have had to be revised to take account particularly of school closures for much of the year. In response to this slowdown in implementing some planned activities, innovations and new measures have made it possible to limit the impact of the pandemic on reaching programme objectives and have even extended them. Fundraising and administration costs have been well managed, at around 7% of total costs. The year 2020 therefore shows earnings of CHF 312,273.- before allocation of funds. However, mandate payments allocated to the free capital in addition to the use of available funds from previous years to cover annual costs, have resulted in a final balance deficit of CHF 21,649.- after allocation of funds, covered by the association's free capital. The latter received an amount of CHF 367,256.- from the year's activities, and thus shows an overall increase of CHF 345,607.-. In 2021 Enfants du Monde will continue with measures to limit the effects of the pandemic, and will maintain its activities not only in current intervention countries but also in other countries depending on how the international situation changes.
